A review of the Halal requirements at the www.hma.jucanada.org website several years ago indicated that the Anhydrous Sodium Sulphate produced by Saskatchewan Mining and Minerals Inc. at the Chaplin facility should, to the best of our knowledge, be eligible for certification i.e. no criteria can be identified that would make the product ineligible.

The raw material is sourced from a natural alkali deposit. Some chemicals, none of which are animal product, animal by-product, enzyme, or ethyl alcohol based, are added in trace amounts to improve operating efficiencies, increase product purity, and/or improve other product parameters. These chemicals are largely consumed in reactions and/or purged in waste streams.

The Anhydrous Sodium Sulphate production equipment and product storage tanks at the Chaplin facility are not used for any other purpose.

Several chemicals, none of which are animal based, are added in trace amounts as process aids and/or to improve product quality.

Saskatchewan Mining and Minerals Inc. does not conduct animal testing on the raw material or on any of the chemical additives.
