



## CALCIUM CHLORIDE

### THE BIOTERRORISM ACT OF 2002

In an effort to ensure the safety of the nation's food supply, Congress passed the Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Preparedness and Response Act of 2002. As a result, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), which has responsibility for developing and implementing regulations under the Act, has established requirements for the registration of all facilities that produce foods or food additives regulated by the FDA. Through these registrations, the FDA is developing a database of locations and emergency contact information for all such facilities.

In response to the Act and to assist customers with compliance programs, Occidental Chemical Corporation (OxyChem) has registered the Ludington facility which manufactures products having potential food contact applications.
